
## 19<sup>th</sup> Maidenhead Scout Group – Cookham day hike

Maintaining social distance during the process of collecting equipment for the activity from the Scout stores: higher risk of infection spread if social distancing not maintained.	Leaders and other adults and Cubs	No equipment required – No High viz required as it will not be dark and we have small numbers to monitor. Cubs will be asked to bring their own drink, packed lunch, sun cream and sun hat and hand sanitiser. Cubs will be lead along the usual route of the District Cubs hike in 2 small groups of 6. Maintaining social distance at drop off and pick up: higher risk of infection spread if social distancing not maintained.	All group members	Drop off at Cookham Train station car park – parents to drop children off one at a time. Parents will be asked to drop cubs off and collect from Cookham railway station car park (The section nearest to Costa Coffee) After consent has been received from the parents or guardians, they will be asked to keep socially distanced at arrival and on pick up. Limit size of groups to 15 including adults.	
Maintaining social distance during meeting: higher risk	All group members	We will limit group sizes to the maximum of 12 Cubs and 3 adults, with social distancing in place. We will continue to remind and encourage children to socially distance s they move around. On arrival at their	

of infection spread if social distancing not maintained.		activity area, before being briefed on the activity in their individual groups, the young people will be reminded of the social distancing rules that have been agreed with their parents/carers.	
Young people stepping outside the social distancing agreed, increasing the chances of the virus spreading	All group members	Where a young person breaks the distancing, a leader should separate as soon as possible from their group. Those involved should then sanitise their hands. If this is a major breach of distancing eg: a bundle/fight, then the incident will need to be recorded by the leaders and the parents/carers should be informed. If the young person repeatedly breaks distancing they may not be allowed to return to face to face meetings for a period defined by the section leader and GSL/AGSL.	
Hygiene of people: higher risk of infection spread if proper hand washing not carried out.	All group members	All involved will be provided with hand sanitiser, on arrival, departure and during as required. Cubs will stop for lunch on Cock Marsh. Young people will be distanced and provided with hand sanitizer before and after eating.	
Hygiene of activity equipment: Higher risk of infection spread if hygiene not carried out.	All group members	No equipment for this activity, only equipment will be brought by the Cubs themselves.	
Use of outdoor spaces: un- even ground, access to space less controlled, cannot be cleaned.	All group members	Controls could include: choice of location appropriate to activity, briefing to leaders and young people on boundaries, checks on the location ahead of use by leaders, hand washing where possible or hand sanitising for all participants.	
Hygiene of toilets: higher risk of infection spread if hygiene not carried out.	All group members	There are no easily accessible toilets on the walk of on the walk and it would also depend on if they are open at the time of activity. All group members attending who need to go will be directed to discreet locations in the bushes, and also need to wash hands afterwards. Parents are asked to remind young people to use the toilet before attending.

Designated parking Cookham train station carpark	All group members plus local residents	Reminders to keep socially distanced at drop off. Encourage use of bikes if possible.

Children falling over, minor accidents.	Cubs	Leaders to carry first aid equipment, contact numbers for numbers and hand sanitiser. First Aid equipment will include a mask, apron and disposable gloves.	
Stinging insects and nettles	Cubs	Parents need to be regularly reminded of the importance of updating us on any allergies that Cubs have.	
Wandering off/ getting lost		Enough adult supervision 3 adults to 12 children. Children will be informed of boundaries and to stay within the park boundaries.	
Depending on timings Young People may be given additional time to play in the Woods at Winter Hill Viewpoint.		Reminders about social distancing while playing, following rules and returning to the set off point at the time requested.
